PUBLIC SPEAKING CONTEST

RULES and DETAILS:

- 1. Participants MUST be Grange Members.
- 2. Participants can compete once in each Category for their age division.
- 3. Participants must follow the rules for each type of speech category.
- 4. Participants must follow time requirements for each category.
- 5. For state, regional and national public speaking contests, props will be allowed, but must be appropriately sized for the room. Points can be deducted for props.

AGE DIVISIONS

Youth: 14 – 21 years of age
Young Adult: 22 – 35 years of age

CATEGORY A: PREPARED SPEECH

Topic: Contestant's choice

Time Limits: Minimum 3 minutes, Maximum 5 minutes

Details: Contestants are required to answer an impromptu question at the end of their speech. Question

will be related to the speech topic.

CATEGORY B: RADIO SPOT SPEECH

Topic: Pretend you are a DJ and you're doing a commercial for Grange.

Time: 60 seconds, exactly

Details: May include 1-2 people; May include music / sound effect introduction and/or background; anything

spoken must be done by 1 contestant; Must provide and operate own music / sound effects; Must provide a complete script (include sound notations); Music/sound effect intros and endings are part of

the 60 seconds; Should relate to the Grange, be original and created by the contestant.

CATEGORY C: IMPROMPTU SPEECH

Topic: Participants draw 2 topics, selects one of the two, and returns the other topic not used.

Time: Minimum of 1 minute, maximum of 5 minutes.

Details: An impromptu speech is delivered without preparation or thought ahead of time. Participants

can sign up for this contest at the conference.

Timekeeper: Timekeeper will hold up hand at the 1-minute mark, then again at the 4½ minute mark so speaker

knows when to stop.

JUDGING CRITERIA

- <u>Technical Elements</u>: Waited till audience was ready; good use of hands; used good eye contact; used appropriate gestures (facial expressions, body language); good articulation; spoke loudly enough; used English appropriate to the speech context; dressed professionally.
- <u>Organizational elements</u>: captured the audience's attention immediately; formulated a clear thesis; followed an organizational pattern (introduction, body, conclusion); attempted appropriate specificity.
- One point will be deducted for every 30 seconds a participant is under or over the time established.

PRIZES

- <u>State Contest</u>: The NC State Grange will award ribbons to the top 3 entrants in each category of speech. First place winners in the prepared speech category will receive a trip to compete at the Regional Conference.
- Regional Contest: National Grange will provide ribbons to the top 3 entrants in each division and age category along with cash prizes: 1st place = \$20, 2nd place = \$15, and 3rd place = \$10. There will be a special award and \$25 presented to the Best of Show at the regional contest. Best of show winners will present speeches at the National Convention in November.
- <u>National Contest</u>: Best of Show winner on the Regional level will participate at the National Convention in November, a trip provided by the NC State Grange. You will also receive \$100 from the National Youth Fund at the Convention.

SIGN-A-SONG CONTEST

DESCRIPTION:

Participants learn how to sign a song of their choice in sign language and perform it for the contest.

CATEGORIES:

- A. <u>SINGLE Sign-a-song</u>: one person signs a song in sign language
 - a. Novice: beginner; has had 3 or less sign language classes; entered contest 2 or less years
 - b. Hobbiest: signs occasionally for fun; entered contest more than 2 years
- B. GROUP Sign-a-song: 2 or more people sign a song together

RULES and DETAILS:

- 1. Participants choose a song and sign the words with the song.
- 2. Participants must provide their own music, either CD or ipod / mp3
- 3. Participants must be Grange Members.
- 4. Participants must provide 3 copies of the words they are signing (for both State AND Regional contests).
- 5. Props and costumes are not allowed.
- 6. Anyone who is a professional instructor or receives money for signing may not enter.
- 7. Only one song may be signed during the competition performance. Medleys are not allowed.
- 8. Participants must sign their own name and song title.
- 9. Participants must inform the audience and judges what type of sign language they will be using.
- 10. Songs must be appropriate for a youth audience and must not contain vulgar language.
- 11. Must turn in attached entry form to enter.

PRIZES

- **1.** <u>State Contest</u>: The NC State Grange will award ribbons to the top 3 entrants in each division. First place winners in each category receive a trip to compete at Regional Conference.
- **Regional Contest**: National Grange will provide ribbons to the top 3 entrants in each division and age category along with cash prizes: 1st place = \$20, 2nd place = \$15, and 3rd place = \$10. A special award is given to the Best of Show. Best of Show winners perform at the Nationals in November.
- 3. <u>National Contest</u>: Best of Show winners on the Regional level can participate at the National Grange Convention in November, a trip provided by the NC State Grange. Participants receive \$100 from the National Youth Fund at the National Convention.

SIGN LANGUAGE CONTEST

DESCRIPTION:

Participants compete by showing the proper sign for a word in sign language.

CATEGORIES:

- Youth (ages 14 20)
- Young Adult (ages 21 35)

RULES and DETAILS:

- 1. Participants must be Grange Members.
- 2. Participants will be given a word to sign using American Sign Language. One point is given for each word signed correctly.
- 3. Depending on the number of participants, the contest will be held in three rounds.
- 4. The person with the most points (most words correct) wins. There is one winner per age category.
- 5. A suggested list of words to learn is provided below to help as a guide.

JUDGING GUIDELINES

- Must show the correct sign for each word given in order to receive a point
- Points are not given unless the sign is completely correct, not half correct

PRIZES

<u>State Contest</u>: Held at Winter Youth Conference, the NC State Grange will award ribbons to the top 3 entrants in the contest in each age category. This contest is unique only to the NC State Grange Youth Program, therefore there is no regional or national contest to compete in.

GRANGE JEOPARDY CONTEST

DESCRIPTION:

Participants compete in a Grange trivia contest in the format of Jeopardy.

RULES and DETAILS:

- 1. Participants must be Grange Members.
- 2. This contest is for Youth (ages 14-20) and Young Adults (ages 21-35).
- 3. Depending on the number of participants, the contest will be held in rounds. Everyone will compete in Round 1 (per age category). Then top 5 for each age category will play Round 2 and Final Jeopardy.
- 4. Just like in Jeopardy, points are added for correct answers and taken away for incorrect answers.
- 5. The person with the most points wins in each age category wins.
- 6. Must turn in attached entry form to enter.

JUDGING GUIDELINES

- There is a point value for each question. That point value is given to a participant when they answer correctly. The point value is taken away from their score if answering incorrectly.
- Just as in the real Jeopardy, answers must be given in the form of a question, "What is...?"

PRIZES

- **State Contest**: Held at Winter Youth Conference, the NC State Grange will award ribbons to the top 3 entrants in the contest. First and second place winners will receive a trip to Regional Conference to compete in the regional contest.
- <u>Regional Contest</u>: The National Grange will provide prizes to the top 3 entrants in the contest. The top two winners of the Regional Contest will move on to compete in the national contest at the National Grange Convention in November.
- <u>National Contest:</u> The national contest is held at the National Convention. Prizes are awarded to first, second and third place. Last year's prize to the winner was a tablet provided by AT&T.

PREPARATION

If you want to prepare, you can look over past National Grange trivia challenges. You may also review resources such as the 1999 Subordinate Grange Manual, National Grange website, any Grange publications (bylaws, national officer roster, digest, etc.) and Grange history books. Preparation is completely up to you. Contact your State Youth Director for any of these materials.

CONTEST ENTRY FORM

NOTE:

All contests will be held at the Winter Youth Conference, Saturday February 16, 2019 at Camp Caraway in Asheboro, NC. Depending on the contest(s) you enter, please do not forgot to bring required items such as music, song lyrics, speech outlines and appropriate attire.

Contestants winning First Place in Prepared Public Speaking, Group and Individual Sign-a-Song, and Grange Jeopardy will be invited to compete at the Regional Youth Conference in July 2019 in Tennessee, for a chance to perform at the National Convention in November 2019 in Minneapolis, MN.
